A Message From Pastor Pat

A Unique Opportunity

Save the date! Sunday, May 5, 2024 from 2:00-3:30 we will welcome the Rev. Melissa Splinder-Smith, Associate pastor in Norwich, to talk with us about the blessing of being human. Her talk is entitled: Our Whole Lives: The Complexity of our Sexual Identity. This presentation invites conversation and reflection about the many aspects of sexual identity, including how we understand ourselves in the 21st century and how we can support the experience of our younger members.

Youth today are growing up in a world where they are blessed to have choices about how to name and express their authentic selves. The progressive church has been woefully silent on this matter and the dominant "religious" voices are about exclusivity, hate and judgement. This is our opportunity to be part of a positive conversation.

When a child is baptized at our church, we ask the congregation if they will support the family as they seek to raise their child and have them grow into their faith. This is a concrete way we can support families as they help their children grow up with a positive body image.

How different might your life have been if you had grown up in an environment that taught a healthy theology of sexuality? How different might your life have been if you grew up in an affirming community that supported you as you grew through the tempestuous teen years?

This is a concrete embodiment of what I say every Sunday, "Whoever you are and wherever you are on life's journey, you are welcome here." It is such a gift that young people today are able to feel they are loved by God exactly as they are! It is also encouraging to know there are religious communities throughout the United Church of Christ are working hard to assure that everyone feels welcomed and affirmed as a child of God!

Come and learn more about the language people are using to describe sexuality, and how each one of us has a complex and unique sexual identity. This is a unique learning opportunity for us all. It is also a way to support young families as they seek to raise their children without some of the religious baggage most of ended up with as we grew up. There will be time for questions after her presentation.

This presentation is appropriate for high school age youth and for middle school youth accompanied by an adult. Childcare for ages 2 and up will be provided. Snacks too!

I hope you will join us for this important conversation whether you have children or not. It is a conversation that needs the support of the entire community.

Faith Formation and Sunday School



In February and March, we extended our exploration of Home to include: our own homes, homes in different parts of the world, and the importance of family, neighbors, neighborhoods, love, and prayer. We heard from our children that people all over the world have a lot in common: the need for water, food, and shelter; the need for love. We learned that we pray so that God will recognize us and we will recognize Him, to ask for what we want and need, and to show thanks for what we receive. We learned that it is easy to talk to God through prayer, as he is our friend.

The study of home extended beyond Sunday School, as families created posters showing the things that they value in their own homes. We all learned a lot by listening to each child. In April we will display these posters as part of a service dedicated to Home.

Gabriela's South Sudan well project continues to move forward. A contribution to the **Iron Giraffe Challenge** has been made under the name Team Ledyard, assuring an

But God asks us to "therefore encourage one another and build one another up, just as you are (not yet) doing" (1 Thessalonians 5:11). Can't we get together just once a month, that's only 12 days a year, "And let us consider how to stir up one another to love and good works,... encouraging one another,..." (Hebrews 10:24-25)?

Men should meet together to

"bear one another's burdens, and so fulfill the law of Christ" (Galatians 6:2). And this is helped, "as iron sharpens iron, so one man sharpens another" (Proverbs 27:17).

From the Historian's Desk



Sunday, April 7, 2024, Holdridge Library, 11 a.m. The next 300th Anniversary Committee meeting

All are welcome – the more the merrier. If we run out of space, we can always move to Fellowship Hall or Social Hall, so join us and bring your ideas.

At the last meeting we had a wonderful discussion of ideas and possibilities of ways to celebrate our upcoming 300th birthday, both Ledyard Congregational Church and Ledyard Ecclesiastical Society. We hope to make much of this a town celebration, as well as our own, since 1725 marks the origin of what became the Town of Ledyard (many years later).

We have plans and proposals in various stages –

- A kick-off Bill Dinner with the Bill library Association, planned for early fall 2025 (celebrating an old town tradition and our connection with the library)
- Tours of various historical properties in town, either as an event or maybe as a "passport"

project for people to do on their own time, or some combination of these

- Cemetery tours, with costumed docents (featuring historical church members)
- Historical skits and activities
- Perhaps a caravan or tour to our "Mother Church" (Groton)
- A visual representation of 300 (paper chain, one-page-per-year sheets, luminaria, ???)
- A gathering of church photos as a slide show
- A research project to learn about the earliest members (and some others of note through the years) and introduce them to the current congregation.
- Maybe a capital improvement to our facilities and/or a contribution to enhance the community at large to mark the occasion
- A rededication service, perhaps as a conclusion to the celebrations in late 2026

With the exception of the Bill Dinner, the timing of these events has not been planned. At this meeting we hope to (1) make further progress on a <u>list of which</u> <u>events we choose to do</u> (limiting the number of large events), how they will work and in what sequence, and (2) <u>a proposed</u> <u>schedule</u> to present to the semiannual meeting in August. It would be good if we can (3) <u>begin to split</u> <u>up responsibility</u> for the planning of each event so we do not all have to be thinking of it all at once! As time passes, event subcommittees could plan, anticipate needs, and welcome interested volunteers for their specific project. We hope to avoid major conflicts with other area events, but probably won't be able to completely do so. Let us know if you are aware of potential conflicts.

At this meeting, we also hope to (4) **plan a float or banner for the** <u>Memorial Day parade this year</u>, welcoming people to the church and

providing a heads-up for the celebrations to come.
