## A Message From Pastor Pat Worship with Us during Lent

During Lent this year we will focus on finding our way home. Joel 2:12-13, "yet even now, says the Lord, return to me with all your heart, with fasting, with weeping and with mourning. Rend our heart and not your clothing. Return to the Lord your God, for he is gracious and merciful, slow to anger and abounding in steadfast love and relents from punishing."

We begin on Ash Wednesday, February 14th with a worship service at 7:00 including the imposition of ashes. Each Sunday during Lent we will focus on a different aspect of what keeps us from God, shame, guilt, anger, doubt and fear. Scripture references and titles are on page 2. We will explore the lives of bible characters who dealt with these issues and how God reached to them with love and grace. Finding our way home to God often leads us through these difficult emotions. The focus is on coming through on the other side and celebrating God's presence with us.

Each Wednesday at 10:30 we gather to study the text that I will use the upcoming Sunday. Please join us!



## From the Church Historian

## LCC Anniversary Committee – the Jan. 14, 2024, meeting

The committee met for the third time, this time with many more in attendance. There was an animated and productive discussion, and we have a start toward planning several events beginning with a "Bill Dinner" in the fall of 2025. We'll use the same format for the next meeting, tentatively scheduled for <u>Sunday</u>, <u>April 7, 11 a.m. in Holdridge Library</u>.

This is a project of the entire church and friends, and it will be as big and complex (or not) as you want to make it. Over the next two years, as Church Historian, I would like to be able to concentrate on research, writing, getting the archives in better order, and checking the accuracy of the publications and other information we put out. We can have fun and still be true to the story! So, join us in putting on a celebration worthy of our 300-year history!

We began by going over what had already been suggested and discussing what factors to consider as we made choices (feasibility, appropriateness, cost, setting, responsibility, potential conflicts, etc.) There were many questions, and you are all welcome to weigh in on the answers.

How do we incorporate the town's

history as well, and encourage the town to celebrate with us? (The Ecclesiastical Society was the predecessor to what became the Town of Ledyard over a century later.)

For each event - is it intended to be educational, entertaining, commemorative? What is the focus?

Scheduling – where should each event fit in the calendar and sequence of events? How far ahead does each project need to be started? How much should we do at once, i.e. should a complex event be broken into smaller events?

Who will organize, who will plan the details and who will carry out projects? Individuals and committees will be needed. There's room for all!

### Some of the events and projects already being planned:

We will have a float or banner in this year's parade, letting people know about events to come.

The Bill Dinner (fall 2025) will be a community event, just as the early ones were, with chowder, speakers, music, and other activities. Dave Holdridge has some great ideas for this gathering to get us started and to emphasize the connection between church and community. The Bill Library Association will, with

friends from the church, have an open house celebrating the history of the Bill Library, from its origins on our balcony to the building we now know, perhaps coinciding with the 2026 Memorial Day parade event.

We will get to know the members of the 1725 congregation, through some genealogy and local history research, similar to a project some may remember from 1993 for the congregation that built the current meetinghouse. I will provide guidance for this project, and hope several of you would like to choose an individual to bring to life.

Chris Schuft would like to put together a slide show or shows of photos of church gatherings. This can represent our recent history as well as much earlier, and will be useful in organizing the many images we already have, as well as ones we hope you will all bring in for scanning.

There was considerable discussion of how to put together visits to historic buildings, cemeteries (Ledyard Center and Bill), bike a/o wagon rides, etc. These could include costumed docents, souvenirs, and other features. Some of these things might be together as a tour, but others might be done over time, similar to the passport program the library has sometimes used. Come help us figure out the best way to accomplish the many

wonderful ideas.

Other events yet to be planned would be a special commemorative service in the sanctuary, and perhaps an event with our "mother" church, Groton Congregational. The children will be involved in all of these but might have fun with wearing the old clothes and trying out the earlier lifestyles.


We hope to provide a visual representation of just how much 300 is, but haven't yet decided how that will be done – perhaps 300 pages displayed with events for each year, or 300 luminaria, or?

Big things like a capital improvement project or some outreach project in the community and small things like souvenirs (perhaps like a Cat's Meow or small crosses from old wood) are on the table. Bring your planning, sewing, cooking, composing, building, acting talents and join us.

In addition to continuing our planning and discussions, our April meeting will have two main goals:

- Plan our participation in this year's Memorial Day parade and
- Pin down a schedule of no more than six events for the fall of 2025 through 2026, to present at the semi-annual meeting this August.



### Socks, Hats, Mittens, and Toiletry Items **Needed for St. Vincent** de Paul Place






