A Message From Pastor Pat

Why Pop in Prayer?

For the last several months the Social Justice Team has sponsored Pop in Prayer Time. For a half hour before the community dinner, you are invited to gather with others in the sanctuary for a time of prayer. Over the past few months, we have sought prayers for particular groups; veterans, those with food insecurity and others.

When people come together to pray, it becomes more than the sum of people gathered. There is power

in offering prayers in community. Sometimes we pray in silence. If we are moved to pray aloud, the prayers are honest and real. We encourage one another. Gathered in silence that is punctuated with spoken prayer, a half hour goes very quickly! Gathering with others to pray helps us with our individual prayer life as well.

Praying allows our intimacy with God to grow. As we come to God honestly and without pretense, we invite God into our lives as they are in the moment. Some moments are lament, some reflect spiritual dryness, sometimes prayer can be filled with gratitude and joy, sometimes prayer is pure confession and still other prayers can be expressions of our anger, disappointment or frustration. There is no such thing as a bad prayer!

Praying regularly gets us past the transactional nature of some prayer. Often prayer sounds like God's to do list. Instead of praying for a specific outcome, try praying that the group/individual for which

you are praying will know God's presence and peace. Praying in intercession for the pain of the world and its people develops a sensitivity in us. We may find that our hearts and souls are drawn to particular concern and it becomes something we devote our time and labor to outside of our prayer time.

Prayer is often done in silence. When we quiet our hearts, minds and mouth, we open ourselves to God's leading and presence. When we pray in silence in community, we tap into the corporate energy of the gathered body. Knowing that others are being honest and transparent before God encourages us to be the same.

Come and pray with us! 5:00-5:30 before the community dinner.


Join us for

The Social Justice team has adopted Micah 6:8 as our guiding verse, *"He has told you, O mortal, what is good; and what does the Lord require of you but to do justice, and to love kindness, and to walk humbly with your God?"*

Mathew 18:20 reads, "For where two or three are gathered in my name, I am there among them." The Social Justice Team recognizes community prayer as one way to bring about personal peace, and the justice of Jesus to all. Praying together can deepen our bonds as a church family. Your prayers can be said in the silence of your heart, or shared aloud. Whether you pray aloud or in silence, you leave Pop-in Prayer with a deeper appreciation of our Church community while affirming that God is at the center of your life.

38-Home Ledyard Neighborhood Moving Forward

Habitat for Humanity of Eastern Connecticut continues to build hope and homes in the region and with much excitement, has received the necessary approvals from zoning in the town of Ledyard to construct a **multi-family subdivision on Colby Drive** consisting of 38 homes. The construction project is being funded by grants and private donations and will consist of a mixture of two, three, and four-bedroom residences. There will be 16 single-

family homes and 11 multi-family homes.

Executive Director Sarah Lufler notes, "It is with great pride we announce the approval of the neighborhood, to be located between the high school and the center of town. It will provide walkable options for residents to grocery stores, dining, recreation, the library, and employment opportunities."

We acknowledge the vision and

cooperation by Ledyard officials including Mayor Fred Allyn III, Elizabeth Burdick, Steve Masalin, and their team at the Ledyard town offices for their time, effort, and support. The date of the groundbreaking is to be announced.

From the Historian's Desk



Here We Are – 300 years!

January 3, 1725, or is it 1726? How about 1725/26? This month marks the 300th anniversary of the first meeting of our North Groton Ecclesiastical Society. While we mark our founding date as 1725, which is the year the society was approved by the General Assembly, and obviously preparations must have begun immediately, the first actual meeting was in January. At the time, the western world was in a very slow transition from an old dating system, in which the new year began March 25, to the January first new year. To keep clear which year was intended, dates in January through March in that era were often recorded as both, making clear what was intended by showing both “old style” and “new style” dates.

Monday, January 3, 1725/26 dawned gray and miserable. Joshua Hempstead notes that it snowed most of the day, with some rain. That didn't stop the residents of North Groton from attending the planned meeting. Capt. John Morgan, who had been one of the prime movers for establishing the

new society, hosted that gathering, presumably with the assistance of his wife Ruth and his many daughters. Capt. Morgan was not a sea captain, but had succeeded his uncle James Morgan as Captain of the local train band, or militia. The fifty-seven-year-old Morgan had substantial property and a home which was probably near the intersection of the current Gallup Hill and Spicer Hill Roads, now across from Ledyard High School.

Minutes from that meeting were very brief but set the basis for the work to come. The first priority was establishing a governing body, then beginning the search for a settled minister and the construction of a meetinghouse. Both would take time, but a dedicated group set to work. They chose Capt. Morgan as moderator for that day, and William Morgan, Junior, as clerk. They then selected a group of “committee men”:

First, Capt. John Morgan
Second, Lieut. Christopher Avery
Third, Sgt. Richard Williams
Fourth, Mr. Ralph Stoddard, Sr.
Fifth, Sgt. Joshua Bill
Sixth, Mr. Samuel Whipple
And seventh Ens. John Dean.

No other business was recorded, but by the next meeting (in February) it was clear that work had begun. The committee was already working on finding a preacher and locating sites for services before a

meetinghouse could be constructed.




Non-Discrimination Declaration
