A Message From Pastor Pat

What's in a Name?

As it turns out, quite a bit. After ample discussion and prayerful consideration, the Board of Worship and Music is returning to the name Board of Deacons. The functionality of the Board will not change. It is a symbolic change in nomenclature that makes us consistent with the New Testament.

“The English word for deacon is the translation of the Greek word diakonos, which appears 29 times in the New Testament. However, only four of those twenty nine occurrences refer to a person. The other instances of the word simply mean servant or messenger or one who ministers for the sake of others.”

As the early church continued to grow there was a need for the “flock” to be cared for while the apostles were out preaching the word. You can read about it in Acts 6. The first seven deacons, were men. Romans 16:1-2, however commends “Phoebe, a servant (diakonos) of

the church at Cenchreae. It is an important issue because it points to the leadership roles that women had in the early church. Jesus had women in his cohort of followers, there was no reason the apostles should not.

The biblical role of deacon as mostly described in Acts 6 and is understood as providing both service and ministry in a way that offered logistical and material support to the elders, so they could concentrate on spreading the gospel. In the life of the early church it was a central role. The role of deacon evolved on the same timeline as the role of elders. Given the role of elders in administering the affairs of the church and overseeing the ministry of the deacons, it is widely believed that the role of pastor grew out of the role of Elder. In some traditions, clergy are called Elders.

In most of the churches I have served the role of the deacon was to tend to the flock, prepare and, in conjunction with the pastor,

administer the sacraments, and assist in worship as needed. All these functions happened faithfully under the Board of Worship and Music, thanks to dedicated visitors and helpers in lots of tasks. The change of name simply brings us closer to the model of the New Testament Church.

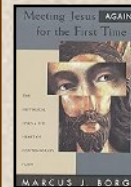

Faith Formation and Sunday School



In January and February, the children in Faith Formation were engaged in a study entitled *From Manger To Home*. This came about as children had questions about where Jesus would live, having been born in a manger. It also seemed like a relevant way to tie in Gabriela's South Sudan Well Fundraising Project, by comparing the homes in South Sudan and our own homes. Children couldn't imagine a home without running water; or what it would be like to have the responsibility of walking several miles daily to gather water for their family and community; or the possibility of getting ill from drinking non-potable water. All of this led to a discussion of helpers. Who are the helpers in their lives? How do they help at home, and each other? A reading of the story of the *Good Samaritan*, singing Mr. Roger's, *Who Are The People In Your Neighborhood*, and the classic children's song, *The More We Get Together*, helped us to express our ideas about helpers and good neighbors. We learned from the children that Gabriela's project reflects God's mandate to treat all people as we would want to be treated. We also learned that our children are helpers in their homes and in their schools. They help a friend on the playground who can't climb the bars without assistance, or

who falls and gets hurt. They help their parents with the dishes, or by offering hugs and kind words.

Additionally, we had a special visit from The Pediatric Dental Health Association. Children met with dental students to learn about proper brushing and the foods that support good dental health. Just another example of helpful people in our extended neighborhoods.

We want to thank everyone who joined Gabriela and Luca in a discussion of the book, *A Long Walk to Water*. Intergenerational conversations offer opportunities for all to broaden perspectives and share ideas. We learned from Gabriela that she continues to find ways to raise more money towards the drilling and upkeep of wells. As these opportunities unfold, we will keep everyone informed.

Our study of home continues into March. Children are constructing posters at home with their families, representing the things that are important to their family's lives and their experience of home. These posters allow the children to share their feelings about home with each other, and deepen their understanding of the many reasons we help others who are in need.

After Easter we will organize a culminating service with Reverend Pat, and share our posters and

insights with the full church community.

As spring approaches, it seems appropriate to move our focus to the outdoors. Nature is alive with examples of birth and rebirth. We are planning to start a garden, perhaps by first planting seeds indoors. We welcome the expertise of those of you who love to garden as we make plans for a children's garden outdoors.

In January, Dolly, Anita, and Alicia met with Melissa Spindler-Smith, the youth minister at Park Congregational Church in Norwich. Melissa is certified to teach the **OWL (Our Whole Lives)** curriculum developed by Unitarian Universalist Association and United Church of Christ Justice and Witness Ministries. It is a sexual education curriculum designed for children, teenagers, young adults, and adults. It is our hope that in the future, Melissa will offer an introduction to this curriculum to our community. Additionally, Park Congregational Church offers a youth activity program on Sunday afternoons, 2:00 -3:30, and our pre-teens and teens are welcome to attend.

The Faith Formation Team is grateful for the guidance and support of our congregation. Please feel free to reach out with your hopes and wishes for a successful Sunday School program.

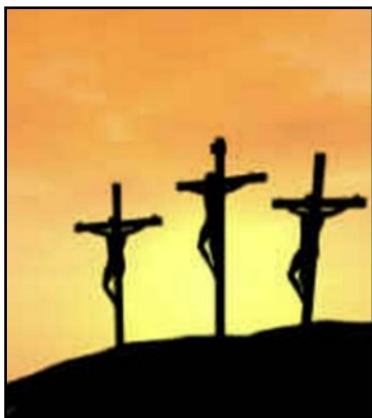

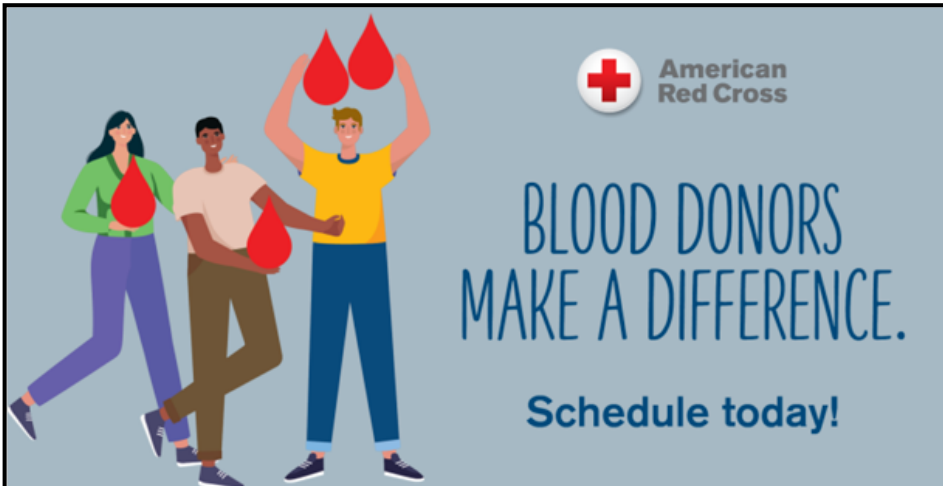

January 6th Pancake Breakfast Update

Our January Pancake Breakfast, highlighting Gabriela DiFilippo's mission project to raise funds to drill wells for water in Southern Sudan was a resounding success!



The profit from the breakfast was \$1,373 and as promised, Missions matched it. Additionally there was \$450 donated online bringing the total raised to \$3,170! On Sunday

January 28th Gabriela and Pastor Pat created a powerful and moving worship service and almost \$1000 was donated that morning. The original goal was to raise \$1,000 for the drilling and upkeep of wells. We now have funds for four wells!
