A Message From Pastor Pat

Our Last Peace and Reconciliation
Session

On May 10th we will complete the formal Peace and Reconciliation
Process. The session is scheduled from 9:30-2:30. A sign-up sheet is on the bulletin board between the offices. The purpose of this meeting is to problem solve. I will choose 5-6 areas that are issues for the congregation to deal with going forward. Then, each participant will have the opportunity to share their ideas about how to problem solve the identified areas. From the ideas generated, an action plan will be

developed and assignments made to appropriate boards and committees for implementation.

Even though the formal process will be over, there is still work to be done. It will take time for us to live into a new identity and reestablish relationships that have been broken or strained. I hope you will use skills you have learned throughout the process to continue working on areas of disagreement and conflict. I am available for interpersonal mediation or small group mediation if there is a need.

In the healing session on April 12th, we had an opportunity to clear the air. About forty-five people gathered to share their feelings about past events, to air their grievances and make a commitment to moving forward. This doesn't mean that all the feelings associated with these events are magically over. We will need to be patient with one another as healing is ongoing. I hope you will be gentle with yourselves and with each other. Moving forward with compassion, understanding and

From the Historian's Desk



May 1725 – 300 years ago

The residents of the northern part of Groton were getting frustrated. The town and church in Groton had no interest in letting them go, but it was a real hardship getting to Sunday services. Maybe it had been easier, seasonally at least, for those along the river, like the Allyns, to cross the water to New London than it was to go cross country to the meetinghouse in Groton. They were determined to do something about it.

There must have been meetings and discussions, although we have no records of just what was said. We have no records from our church at all from that period, nor even an ecclesiastical society. However, from colonial records at the Connecticut State Archives we get a peek into what was going on. The General Court (or General Assembly) met twice a year at the time, once in May and once in October, for a few days each. Their record volumes and collected papers fill in some of the story.

Penning a more dramatic wording to accomplish their goals, Captain Morgan and his neighbors drew up a

new petition, this time to the General Assembly, citing the impossibility of attending regularly, "so that our families are in Danger of being Left destitute of the means of Grace and salvation to there utter ruin." Having asked the town for assistance in this matter, and being rejected, "putt us into Disquiet and sorrow." They requested that the Assembly "Relive us and Grant us the Liberty and previledges of being a Distinct Society by our selves."

The town of Groton got wind of this petition and wrote to the Assembly, stating that they thought they had come to an agreement between the north and the south to survey for the center of the entire town, and build a new meetinghouse there. Apparently not everyone saw it the same. The north's petition was delivered to the assembly, apparently by Capt. John Morgan, but the town wrote, "We their for pray that their petesion may not be herd."

In spite of Groton's protest, the General Assembly took the request seriously, and assigned a committee of Capt. Timothy Peirce, Capt. Thomas Noyes and Mr. Joseph Bacchus to "make diligent inquiry into the circumstances of said parish," set some proposed boundaries, and report back at the October session.

Faith Formation and Sunday School



In April, children in Sunday School have been both thoughtful and active. Exploring the meaning of Lent as a time to renew our relationship to God in preparation for Easter, the children read the Bible, and engaged in big themes. What does God's love mean in our lives? How do we experience it? The children tell us that we experience and share God's love through friendship, by sharing what we have with others, by being kind, and by knowing that we are loved and that God will always love us. They celebrated Easter Sunday with an Easter Egg Hunt. Eggs contained Bible verses, and the children also received goodie bags.

Spring is the perfect season to renew and expand our relationship

with God. Children planted the flower seeds saved from last year's harvest, and chose other seeds to plant in trays. Through this handson activity, children experience both the miracle and science of nature as our seeds sprout and grow. It's an exciting time! Inch by inch, row by row, God bless these seeds we sow, and warm them from below 'til the rain comes tumbling down. (David Mallett)

In May, the children will spend time outdoors exploring the wonders of nature. They will plant their seedlings in raised beds, and they will learn how to care for plants in a garden. Please dress appropriately.

We will celebrate Bible Sunday on May 11 during the Sunday Service. Children will receive a bible and remain with the congregation as we reflect on the importance of The Word in our daily lives.

Behind the Scenes in Sunday School

The Faith Formation Team meets monthly and provides guidance for the weekly planning that goes into Sunday School. The content of the Sunday School lessons follows an overarching theme, and connects to the Sunday scripture readings. The goal is to help children explore their personal relationship to God. The format may include:

- A Circle Gathering: introductions, sharing information, prayer and song
- Reading: a trade book or bible reading
- Activity: appropriate to the day's topic
- Closing: saying goodbye

Faith Formation meets the second Wednesday of every month at noon. Our next meeting is May 14th and all are welcome.



Safe Church Committee

The Safe Church Committee was formed in January. Committee members are: Rob Burns, Sue Burns, Dolly Hayes, Rev Pat Liberty, and Beth Smith.

The committee has reviewed safety checklists for First Aid, Buildings and Grounds, Fire Protection and Prevention, Public Areas, and the Kitchen. Recommendations for areas identified as needing attention have been or are being addressed, e.g., clearing items out the boiler room, scheduling a kitchen deep clean for June, as well as creating and posting evacuation exit maps in strategic locations.

A fire drill is scheduled for Sunday, May 18, following the church service. The congregation will be informed a few weeks ahead with specific information about the drill and the evacuation procedures. Questions and concerns about the fire drill or any other aspects of safety can be expressed to any of the committee members.

The next Safe Church Committee meeting will be on Thursday, May 8th at 5:00 p.m. in the Holdridge Library.



Pastor Pat's Vacation
